In 2011, the Ministry of Health and Long Term Care (MOHLTC) requested Critical Care Services Ontario (CCSO) to lead a planning process to develop a comprehensive neurosurgical system to meet the needs of adult and paediatric patients across Ontario. As a part of this program, the MOHLTC also committed new nursing positions, including clinical Neurosurgical Outreach Nurse and Neurosurgical Nurse Educator positions, to support the management of specialized paediatric and adult neurosurgical patients.

The Neurosurgery Education and Outreach Network (NEON) was established in May 2013 to work in collaboration with the Provincial Neurosurgery Advisory Committee to support the educational component of recommendations to better integrate access to neurosurgical services in the province. Originally comprised of Nurse Educators and Program Directors from each of the province's adult neurosurgical centres, their work formed the foundation for an educational outreach program designed to provide a wide breadth of education to non-neurosurgical centres on neurosurgical patient's care across the continuum. Post op Complications Following a Craniotomy

Definitions

- <u>Craniotomy</u>: defines a procedure where the cranial cavity is accessed through removal of bone to perform a variety of brain surgeries. Once the surgery is completed, the bone flap is returned to its previous position
- <u>Craniectomy:</u> differs from a craniotomy in that the bone is not replaced to its previous position: instead it is stored for future insertion or may be discarded depending on pathology (i.e.. Infection). This results in cranial defect
- If the bone flap is discarded, it is replaced with a custom made implant
- <u>Cranioplasty:</u>replacement of the bone flap

Complications

The major risks following a craniotomy that will be discussed in this webinar include the following:

- 1. Infection
 - i. Surgical Site Infection
 - ii. Meningitis
- 2. Cerebrospinal Fluid (CSF) Leaks
- 3. Hydrocephalus
- 4. Swelling/Expansion
- 5. Elevated Intracranial Pressure (ICP)
- 6. Herniation

Your Role

- ✓ Conduct neuro-vital sign checks more often to detect, document and identify the trend in status
- ✓ Enact nursing interventions to decrease ICP
- ✓ Communicate
- ✓ Be persistent
- ✓ Work with MD to treat underlying causes
- ✓ Support family
- ✓ Document

Outreach in Action- LHIN 11



On September 6, 2019 we had an amazing opportunity to travel to a rural hospital to host a Neuro Education Day. We had a total of 33 participants, which included attendees from 7 different outlying areas. Participants travelled as far as 340 km to attend this session!

The morning began with the introduction of 3 neuro case scenarios in which the participants were asked to score the GCS. Staff gained a true appreciation on the various assessments that occur from practitioner to practitioner based on interpretations of the language on the GCS scale. Participants could truly appreciate the different ways in which health care providers actually score the GCS. We included breakout sessions for the remainder of the agenda for the participants to take part in log rolling, and consideration of C-Spine precautions, application of a cervical collar and information on the Jewitt Brace and Halo devices. Theresa Murray, our Trauma Coordinator for HSN joined this session as well to discuss initial trauma assessments in the ER department.

The day was a huge success! Feedback from participants left them craving for more education! Our next travels will be in the spring of 2020 where we will reach out to a larger hospital and extend the invitation to the outlying hospitals in that area. 



What causes a subdural hematoma?


